PROFESSIONAL EXHIBITORS are for those professional artists who TEACH, SELL, or have gallery shows. If you are hired to create a piece of art for a client, you are considered a professional.

SEMI-PROFESSIONALS are for those who engage in arts and crafts work as a HOBBY or for the love of the work, they may sell some art, however, do not make their living from the sales, if you have made \$1 or more in art, you are no longer an amateur, except for cash prizes and Cash Awards. If you attend classes or clinics in art, you are no longer an amateur.

AMATEURS are those that treat art as a hobby only. They do not take professional classes; they have never made any money in art, with the exception of cash prizes and awards.

NOVICE artists, have never won a blue ribbon in any show in art.

ADULT RULES

- Entries must be the original work of the exhibitor within **two years** of the opening date of the fair to be eligible for premium awards.
- Entries shown in previous El Dorado County fairs will not be accepted.
- Professional exhibitors are not permitted to enter Semi-Professional.
- PROFESSIONAL ENTRIES MAY BE FRAMED, IF SO: FRAME/GALLERY WRAP** and ready for hanging with **screw eyes and wire**, or they will not be hung.
- Size of entries is limited to no larger than 36"x48".
- All entries must have a title on the entry form.
- Copyright mark with date of creation is recommended in all works.
- Exhibitor's name shall be printed on the back of the entry. Exhibitor's name should not be exposed on the front of picture. If a name is on the front, please cover with tape.
- Nude studies or unpleasant, non-family friendly pieces will not be accepted and/or displayed.

- Professional and Semi-Pro Exhibits may be sold. A 20% commission will be charged. Entries must be labeled "FOR SALE" and the price indicated on the entry form. If it is not listed for sale on entry form and price, it will not be listed. Price changes may not happen without a \$5 change fee. Sales must occur during Fair & purchaser must pick up item on release date, Monday following close of Fair.
- Insurance desired on any entry must be carried by the exhibitor. The fair will assume no responsibility for any article that is lost, stolen, or damaged.
- No entries will be released without a claim check or ID.
- No entries may be removed during the Fair.
- Classes may be combined to ensure 3 to a class. Premiums will only be paid if there are at least three in a class.**
- STATE RULES APPLY**
- Entries will not be accepted if the above rules are not followed.**

- Special attention should be given to the Category and Style designations so that entries will be judged according to the proper style. Entries in categories where BJCP Style Guidelines require specific descriptions must have the necessary information on entry forms and bottle labels.
- Each entry consists of four (4) bottles, 12 oz., brown or green glass, free of commercial labels, raised marks or lettering or other identifying markings that are not part of the official entry label. For Strong Ale and Mead categories only, four (4) 7 oz. bottles will be accepted. Clear glass bottles will not be accepted in beer categories.
- Please attach with a rubber band a properly completed official bottle ID label (no tape or glue).
- **BE SURE** that each entry has an accompanying Entry Form, with payment attached.

A lock of rinsed fleece, not washed with soap, must be attached to the envelope. Entries not following this procedure, may be disqualified.

Non greasy hair fleeces and fiber must also be presented in the best possible condition skirted, and rolled in paper of an appropriate size.

- E. Purebred fleece should be placed in a class most appropriately fits that Breed's Standard description of wool grade. Market or cross bred fleece should be placed in a class which most appropriately describes its individual wool grade.
- F. If the above rules and requirements are not met, the entry may be refused at receiving.
- G. The judge has the authority to reclassify or disqualify fleeces before making awards.

- E. Due to space limitations, some quilts may not be seen in their entirety or hung. All ribbon winners will be fully displayed. *Note: At the discretion of the quilt show coordinators, if a single class is determined to have too large a number of entries, it may be divided into two groups; also, quilts may be reassigned for judging purposes.*
- F. If your name appears on the entry, it must be concealed with a temporary covering (i.e. paper or masking tape over the name on the entry). This will be reviewed at the time of entry check-in. Please allow extra time at check-in for verification of entry specifications.
- G. **All entries MUST have a standard 4-inch finished sleeve attached across the entire back top edge of the entry**

1. **Quilts made by Two or More Persons** – More than one person involved in making the top, or quilting, or binding the quilt.

3. **Division 142 – Appliqué Quilts** – Techniques include: hand, machine, turned edge, fused or soft/raw edge.

7. **Division 146 – Mixed Techniques** – A quilt using multiple techniques such as embroidery and piecing, pieced background with appliqué on top, mixed pieced and appliquéd blocks.
8. **Division 147 – Miniature Quilts** – A miniature quilt is a scaled-down version of a larger quilt. Traditional Class includes pieced, applique, or a combination of both; Innovative Class includes techniques that bring something new to the quilt element reflecting creativity such as an idea, method, fabric, embellishment, or surface design.
9. **Division 148 – Art Quilt** – A quilt of any size that extensively uses non-traditional techniques to show originality in theory, design, color or techniques; must be an original design not using a commercial pattern.
10. **Division 149 – Specialty Quilts** – A quilt of any size that does not fit in the other categories such as: Photo Quilts, Memory and T-shirt Quilts, Yo-Yo, Cathedral Window, and Whole Cloth.
11. **Division 150 – Other Quilted Items** – Class 1 must be 3 layers, 2 of fabric separated by a layer of batting and held together by stitches. Class 2 thru 4 is defined as a minimum of 2 layers held together with stitches and may or may not have batting/stabilizer. All entries must be quilted and will be verified at entry check-in.

STATE RULES APPLY

- A. Exhibits in the Flowers & Plants Department must have been grown by the exhibitor except for arrangement classes.
 - B. Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled with common name of plant.
 - C. Exhibits must be renewed and kept fresh by the exhibitor daily from 8 to 9 am on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
 - D. The department chair will provide entry tags. Exhibitors must verify that the information on them is correct.
 - E. Entries are not to be touched or moved by the exhibitor after being placed by the department chair.
 - F. Sweepstakes will be awarded in accordance with State Rules IV-7.
 - G. Judging will be done strictly according to the schedule. The American System of judging will be used.
 - H. Entries must include the **EXACT** number of blooms, stems, etc. specified. Leaves should be removed.
 - I. Exhibitors must provide drainage saucers for all potted plants.
 - J. The fair will furnish containers for all entries in the cut flower division. No bottles, tin cans, or fruit jars accepted.
 - K. In Cut Flower Division, a stem should contain just one flower, unless otherwise noted. The exceptions are: Ageratum, Cosmos, Forget-Me-Nots, French Marigolds, Petunias, and some roses. The portion of the stem of these flowers may contain more than one bloom.
 - L. No dressing, wiring, artificial flower or fillers permitted. Wedging permitted, provided by the exhibitor.
 - M. Hybrid Tea Roses, Hybrid Perpetuals and large Exhibition Dahlias to be shown debudded. Stems should be approximately 9 to 12 inches or in proportion to the flower.
 - N. In Fresh Arrangements, plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor. Foliage or accessories permitted in all classes of the Arrangements Division unless otherwise noted. No artificial flowers or dried flowers allowed.
 - O. No Dry Arrangement entry will be accepted if exhibit has been exhibited and placed at any previous El Dorado County Fair.
 - P. Every exhibit will be subject to departmental rules but the association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur and entries are made and accepted on this condition.
 - Q. All plant materials used in garden exhibits must be growing, unless otherwise specified.
 - R. Plant material and flowers should be well hardened and groomed.
 - S. Plant material on State Conservation List may not be exhibited.
 - T. **FRESH FLOWERS OR PLANT MATERIAL** must be used in all arrangements except those specifically indicated otherwise. NO ARTIFICIALLY COLORED fresh plant material or ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS are permitted.
 - U. **FRESH FOLIAGE** permitted in all arrangements unless otherwise noted. Succulents may be classed by foliage. NO ARTIFICIAL foliage may be used.
 - V. **DRIED MATERIALS** may be sparingly colored and treated.
 - W. **Adult exhibitors must have owned potted plants at least 3 months prior to beginning day of Fair. (This rule does not apply to Youth exhibitors)**
- NOTE:** Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed; checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours.

GLOSSARY

CUT FLOWERS

- a. **ANNUAL:** A plant that completes its outdoor cycle of growth in one year.
- b. **BIENNIAL:** A plant that normally completes its outdoor cycle of growth in two years.
- c. **PERENNIAL:** A plant that lives, blooms, and seeds for more than two years. Trees and shrubs are hardwood perennials.
- d. **HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS:** A plant that lives longer than two years, but in colder climates dies back to the ground each winter.
- e. **SPIKE:** A flower structure with flowers, stem less or very short stemmed, on a common length stalk, i.e., Gladiolus.
- f. **SPRAY:** Portion of a plant with a number of flowers on one stem, with at least two flowers open, i.e. Cosmos and Salpiglosses.
- g. **STEM:** The main ascending part of a plant.
- h. **STALK:** A stiff stem which may or may not branch one or more flowers and buds.
- i. **BLOOM:** Individual flowers, one blossom on a stem, i.e., H.T. Roses, Carnations, all disbudded.
- j. **SPECIMEN:** A single plant, fruit, vegetable, bloom or spike, spray, stalk or stem.
- k. **NOVICE:** One who has not won a blue ribbon in any organized flower show. A novice may enter Novice, Amateur, and Open Classes.
- l. **AMATEUR:** One who has won 10 or fewer blue ribbons in any organized flower show, and is not, or has not been, engaged in commercial enterprise. An amateur may enter Amateur and Open Classes.
- m. **OPEN:** Open to all, including judges, amateur accredited judges, instructors, and professionals.

- A. State and Local Rules and Regulations shall apply.
- B. Exhibitors must have prepared their own entry since the close of last year's fair, with the exception of "Family" entries. These may be created together, as a family project.
- C. All products being considered for the cash awards which have not otherwise been eliminated from consideration will be opened.
- D. Each food entry must consist of two (2) identical examples: one to be judged and one for the display exhibit. Vinegars, Cordials, Liqueurs, Honey, and Syrups excluded. Please refer to Rule G below.
- E. All jars must be standard clear canning jars with a two (2) part lid and ring band closure. No products requiring refrigeration will be accepted. **All canning must be in sealed jars. No paraffin wax.**
- F. Labels must be no larger than 1"x2" or round and may be placed on the side of the jar (exception youth, teen & 4H) or on top of lid. Labels must state name of product, date canned, and method used. (Example: the initials W.B. for Water Bath, P.C. for Pressure Canner, S.T. for Steam Canned).

THE NAME OF EXHIBITOR MUST NOT BE ON THIS LABEL.

New: TEEN, YOUTH & 4H: Both jars MUST be labeled on their lids. Fair staff will cover lid with an additional label as to keep anonymous. Adult entries MAY have labels on lid and will be treated anonymously also.

- G. Vinegars, Cordials, Liqueurs, Honey, or Syrups **only:** Containers must be as follows: One (1) **Tamper-Proof**, labeled bottle, jar, or other container for the display exhibit and one (1) labeled ½ pint or standard pint canning jar for the judging.

***NEW:** High acid foods that require processing time of 45 minutes or less, may be processed in an atmospheric steam canner. The processing time is the same as for a boiling water canner, adjusted as necessary for altitude. For more information, go online to National Center for Home Food Preservation:

- H. Canning Methods: All Low Acid Foods, all vegetables, tomatoes containing vegetables, meat, poultry or fish must be canned **Under Pressure**. All high acid foods, jams, jellies, soft spreads, fruit, pickles, tomatoes, condiments and juices must be processed in a **boiling water bath canner or a steam canner**. Borderline high acid fruit, such as figs, tomatoes, tomato products or Asian pears must be made more acidic by adding lemon juice or citric acid as directed in the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning. For more information, refer to the National Center for Home Food Preservation website.
NOTE: Open kettle or inversion methods will not be allowed to enter.
- I. Dried products must have a minimum of ½ cup in each jar.
- J. Kombucha must be bottled in Grolsch-style bottles or tightly sealed container. Kombucha may not be stored at room temperature more than 14 days.
- K. American Judging is traditional placing: One first place, one second and one third places will be awarded. Danish judging is when exhibits are judged upon their own merit. There may be more than one first place, second place or third place exhibits.
- L. **DUE TO FOOD SAFETY ISSUES, WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ACCEPTING PRODUCTS THAT DO NOT ABIDE BY THE ABOVE RULES**
- M. **TEEN Exhibitors** may enter this division if they are at least 14 years of age and have not yet had their 19th birthday before the opening of the fair. TEENS will be judged "American" and will receive ribbons, no prize money, with the exception of the Best of Show sponsored by Marshall Grange #451.
- N. **YOUTH exhibitors** may enter this division if they have not yet had their 14th birthday before opening day of the fair. Youth exhibitors will be judged by the "Danish" system and will receive ribbons, however, no cash prizes with the exception of the Best of Show sponsored by Frosty Firs Christmas Tree Farm of Apple Hill.

ADULT

The quality desired in Fruits & Veggies (agriculture and horticultural) products exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that stage of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the Food and Agriculture Code in order to be considered for Cash Awards. (Exception, non-ripe classes)

Section 42513: "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant, or vine. - A. The purpose of the exhibit is to create interest in gems and minerals for collecting and identification lapidary arts and earth sciences.
- B. Any individual or organization may enter displays. There is no age limit.
- C. In the Mineral Specimens Division, specimens entered may be from any source, but the judge shall show preference for California minerals. In all Divisions, the judge shall show preference for displays that are most effectively educational, as shown by the information provided by the Exhibitor and the method of presentation. The attractiveness of the display and the variety of material shall also be considered.
- D. Each exhibitor is to include a **Theme Label** in the display giving a description of the Class. **Examples:** Variety of Worldwide Minerals, Self-Collected Minerals, Mounted Gemstones, Lapidary Arts – Slabs (work done by exhibitor), etc. If there is only one specimen the theme label may be incorporated into the descriptive label.
- E. In the Lapidary Arts Division, preference shall be given to work that has been done by Exhibitor. Required labeling is to indicate whether or not work was done by Exhibitor
- F. Exhibitor is to correctly and adequately label specimens:
- G. Mineral specimens must be labeled as to identification of Name and Variety, and Location in which they were found.
- H. Fossil specimens must be labeled as to identification of Common Name, Phylum, Class or Subclass, Time Period, and Location in which they were found.
- I. Petrified wood, wood casting and plant life specimens must be labeled as to identification of Species, Time Period, and Location in which they were found.
- J. All previous first place competitive entries must have at least 20% new material. However, past first place winners may enter same exhibit in a non-competitive class.
- K. **Cases:** Fairgrounds shall provide cases including lights. Exhibitor shall provide case liners and risers. (Liners and risers are recommended to enhance the exhibit). Each entry is limited to one case or one-half case, depending upon material. Display supervisor may assign smaller displays (such as single-specimen mineral, jewelry, lapidary) a portion of a case. Exhibitor shall be contacted regarding case usage.
- L. Interior dimensions of display cases supplied by Fairgrounds are: 45" wide x 22" deep x 22" high. Interior dimensions of a half case are: 22 ½ wide x 22" deep x 22" high.
- M. Exhibitor may provide his or her own case(s). This should be noted on application along with exterior dimension of

case(s). The maximum exterior dimensions of a case shall not exceed 48" wide x 24" deep x 24" high.

- N. Exhibitors are not limited as to the numbers of entries; however, they can only receive one cash award per person per class or two cash awards per family per class.
- O. The judging criteria for each entry shall be available in the Fair Office upon request.
- P. The judge shall not award a premium or ribbon where there is insufficient merit.
- Q. Judging shall be according to American Federation of Mineralogical Society (AFMS) Uniform Rules as appropriate. These rules are available on the AFMS website (www.amfed.org) or from the El Dorado County Mineral and Gem Society. To the extent AFMS rules do not apply, scoring shall be in accordance with El Dorado County Mineral and Gem Society procedures. Decision of the judge in all matters is final.

STATE RULES APPLY

- A. Entries must be entered in the appropriate class to receive judging. Judge has the authority to move an exhibit to an appropriate class.
- B. Entries must be the original work of the exhibitor, except for processing and mounting the final exhibition print.
- C. Entries must have been taken within the last 3 years.
- D. Entries shown in any previous El Dorado County Fairs are not allowed.
- E. Exhibitor's name should be printed on the back of the picture. Exhibitor's name should not be exposed on front of picture. **If the name is on the front, please cover with tape.**
- F. Adult Photographs must have an image size of at least 35 square inches (i.e., 5"x7") and no larger than 320 square inches (i.e., 16" x 20") or up to 36"x48" including frame for Professional entries.
- G. Nude studies, unpleasant and "non-family friendly" photos or art **will not be accepted/displayed.**
- H. No entries will be released without a claim check or ID
- I. No entries may be removed during the fair, prior to release time.
- J. The fair will assume no responsibility for any entry that is lost, stolen or damaged.
- K. J. Photographs printed on NON-TRADITIONAL PHOTO PAPER, must be entered in the "ALTERNATIVE" category or class.
- L. Limit of one photograph per mat board or foam core.
- M. **Do not affix a hanger on the back of mat board or foam core.** The mat board or foam core will be hung by adhesive Velcro strips. The Velcro strips will be provided and attached to the back of the mat board or foam core by Fair staff on the day the entry is received. Velcro removal may result in some damage to the back of the mat board or foam core.

- N. All FRAMED exhibits **MUST BE IN A SUITABLE FRAME/GALLERY WRAP** and ready for hanging with **screw eyes and wire**, or they will not be hung.

Example: Those professional artists who TEACH or SELL any art, have their work in a gallery or on a web site for sales or promotion or is hired, with monetary gain, to take pictures.

The following rules apply to Professional Exhibitors only

- S. **Professional photographers** are not permitted to enter Semi-Professional Divisions.
- T. Professional Photographs do not have to be framed.
- U. Canvas Wrap is acceptable for PROFESSIONAL only.
- V. If not framed: The mat board or foam core must be **WHITE. Colored matting or colored foam core WILL NOT be acceptable. Double matting is acceptable.** Photographs should be affixed with photo safe double sided tape, 3M 77 Spray Mount, or hot set adhesive backers. **Do not use rubber cement.**

SEMI-PROFESSIONAL

AMATEUR

Photographers that take photos as a hobby; have never received any remuneration for their photos except for cash prizes or awards or the cost of creating the art work. Amateur exhibitors may not have taken extensive classes or workshops in photography. Amateurs do not have a website.

An Amateur that wins BEST OF SHOW two or more times must move up to the Semi-Professional classes.

NOVICE

Exhibitors may not have won a 1st Place or Best of Show Ribbon in any Photography contest. Novice exhibitors do not and have not sold photos in the past nor have taken professional photo classes or workshops.

- G. If the project is for sale, please mark "for sale" with sale price on Entry Form. All inquiries regarding sale of entry will be referred directly to the exhibitor.

ALL THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. CASH AWARDS MAY BE WITHHELD IF COMPLIANCE WITH PRINTED STATE AND LOCAL RULES IS NOT FULLY MET.

EXHIBITOR FAIR ADMISSION | \$18.00

A **\$18.00 four-day gate admission wristband** is available for **all exhibitors (livestock and still)** at this special reduced rate. Wristbands must be purchased at the time of entering. There are no unpaid or free passes for exhibiting in the Fair.

DEFINITIONS

American Judging System: A judging process where each exhibit is not only judged on its own merit, but in comparison to other exhibits.

Danish Judging System: A judging process ranking each exhibit according to how well it meets that standard, rather than how it compares with other exhibits. Judging Scale: 1st Group being "Superior" receiving a Blue Ribbon, 2nd Group being "Good," receiving a Red Ribbon and 3rd Group being "Average" receiving a White Ribbon.

Junior: Exhibitors ages 18 and under. The departments are divided into: *Youth* (13 and under) and *Teen* (14-18 years of age).

CASH AWARDS

The El Dorado County Fair Board of Directors may prorate cash awards paid if the total amount to be paid exceeds budgeted amount. Judging Sheets will be used as evidence for payment of Cash Awards. Ribbons and tags are not acceptable as evidence.

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed; checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours. Checks will be combined.

Cash awards will not be awarded if there are less than three exhibits in a class.

Sponsored Cash Awards are not the responsibility of the Fair, if a Sponsor does not pay the Fair, those cash awards will not be awarded.

1. Entries must be mailed to El Dorado County Fair, 100 Placerville Drive, Placerville, CA 95667, or presented in person at the Fair Entry Office, El Dorado County Fairgrounds, 100 Placerville Drive, Placerville 95667. All entries must be postmarked or in the possession of the El Dorado County Fair no later than the dates and times indicated in the Entry Guide. Entries should be made as early as possible. Entry fees and other required papers must accompany entry forms at the time of entry and will be accepted anytime following distribution of the Entry Guide. Checks should be payable to "EDCF" or "El Dorado County Fair Association". All livestock registration papers are checked upon registration of entries.
2. All classes are open to the world, except Junior Livestock.
3. The theme of this year's Fair is: **"Stars & Stirrups."**
4. The fair management shall reserve the right to limit entries in ALL classes to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination.
5. Checks for awards in all classes will be made out in the name and address appearing on the entry form.
6. **ALL PREMIUM CHECKS ARE VALID FOR SIX MONTHS FROM DATE OF ISSUE. Requests for checks to be reissued will be subject to a \$20 handling fee. All unclaimed premium checks as of December 31 will be considered donations to the El Dorado County Fair Association.**
7. All discrepancies in payment of Cash Awards must be reported to Fair Management in writing, no later than 30 days after the close of the fair or they will not be considered. Ribbons will not be replaced by the fair after once being awarded.
8. All booths and exhibits will be constructed with the use of **non-flammable** material or material treated with flame retardant chemical.
9. No person or exhibitor will be permitted to distribute printed or advertising material or put up signs on the grounds without written permission of the fair manager.
10. Any display or exhibit not in keeping with the standards for division or class entered will not be allowed to remain on display after judging. Fair Management, who will be the sole judge of these standards, will make this decision. No refund of entry fees will be made for exhibits eliminated under this rule.
11. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to correctly fill out his own entry forms and thereby accepts responsibility for all errors thereon. Office personnel assist and answer questions but under no circumstances will complete entry forms for exhibitors. Judges may move items to classes that they feel exhibit fits better in. Entering classes correctly is sole responsibility of exhibitor. Exhibits entered incorrectly may be deemed ineligible before, during or after judging.
12. The Board of Directors may extend a grace period after any & all deadlines to accept late submissions with a \$25.00 penalty.
13. Request for refunds must be formally written and presented to the fair manager for consideration. Refunds may be granted within the limits of the State Rules: Refunds may be made only because of sickness, accident or death, cancellations of a class or return of entries for lack of exhibit space. For animal classes, request must be made prior to Fair week or event, whichever comes first and **MUST** be accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate.
14. Overpayment of entry fees totaling \$10.00 or less will not be refunded.
15. No entries will be released without the official tag or ID proving ownership.
16. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any direct or consequential loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by and rising from animals or articles exhibited by him and shall indemnify the association against any legal proceedings in regard thereto. All property of every kind entered for competition or display or for any purpose being on the fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of this association. The association will exercise care and precaution for its safe preservation, but in no case will this association or its officers or agents be liable for damages or injury to a person or property of any exhibitor or patron of the fair, or be responsible for any accident, loss or damage of whatsoever nature that may occur on the fairgrounds or at any other place or time. Should property owners desire protection against loss or damage or injury from fire or other causes, they must make their own arrangements.

17. No entries may be nude studies or “non -family friendly.”
18. No food and beverage entries may contain cannabis or cannabis related ingredients.

DISPUTES

THE MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE FINAL AND ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO ARBITRARILY SETTLE QUESTIONS OR DIFFERENCES.

Protests/Disputes will only be considered if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, tail dock officials and timers cannot be disputed and are final.

Protests (must be in writing) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 or \$200 if the protest relates to violations of State Rules X-XA (Animal Health Rules). The deposit will only be returned if the protest is upheld. Protest must be filed within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest.
