Rules:

- A. All exhibits must be produced by the exhibitor.
- B. Electric exhibits must be complete and in an operating condition where applicable.
- C. When necessary, exhibits are to be mounted on a base for structural support and proper presentation.
- D. Rocketry projects are to be entered in “Any Other” Ag. Mechanics, not listed.”
- E. Metalworking and woodworking projects must include a description stating the cost of material or Source and value if donated.
- F. Projects entered must have been started and finished in the current school year.
- G. Projects from assembly kits may not be entered

Ability to Auction FFA, GRANGE and 4-H Ag. Mechanics Projects at a Silent Auction during the Jr. Livestock Auction

- 1. Ag Mech exhibitors must be enrolled in the current year's Ag Mech classes, Grange or 4-H projects. No independents.
- 2. Projects must be supervised by an Ag teacher or 4-H or Grange leader.
- 3. Projects must have earned a blue ribbon to sell at the silent auction.
- 4. Only one item can be sold, but two items per person per class may be entered.
- 5. Exhibitors may sell a market animal and a silent auction item.
- 6. JLA Committee will keep the same percentage of auction earnings as in Livestock Sales.
- 7. If the project IS NOT to be Sold, it must be marked on the entry form, as “No Sale.”
- 8. If there is a minimum Bid amount, that MUST be marked on the entry form.
- 9. Students selling projects are obligated to help with the auction activities on the auction day.
- 10. Items to be sold must be moved by the exhibitor to the sale area one hour before the auction begins, on sale day (Saturday of the Fair).
- 11. Code of Conduct, Jr. Livestock and Local Fair Rules and Regulations apply here, as well as the uniform rule.
