The quality desired in Fruits & Veggies (agriculture and horticultural) products exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity to that stage of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the Food and Agriculture Code to be considered for Cash Awards. (Exception, non-ripe classes)

Section 42513: "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree that will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant, or vine. Section 42515: "Overripe" means having an advanced stage of maturity that causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state. A VARIETY OF PRODUCTS MUST BE ADEQUATELY AND CORRECTLY LABELED IN ACCORDANCE WITH DIVISION AND CLASS AS APPEARS IN THIS ENTRY GUIDE. IF THIS IS NOT DONE, ENTRY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

RULES

STATE RULES APPLY

- A. Entry must include the exact number of fruits, vegetables, etc., as specified in the class description.
- B. El Dorado County Fair will furnish uniform containers for plate displays.
- C. Leafy vegetables and herbs may be received in an enclosable plastic bag for freshness.
- D. **BUNCHES MUST BE TIED.**
- E. Fruits and vegetables may be entered in a "non-ripened" class and also may be from cold storage from the previous year's crop.

NOTE: Cash award checks **WILL NOT** be mailed, checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours.

DEFINITIONS

HOME GARDENER: A grower who raises produce for use by friends and family only. THE GROWER DOES NOT SELL THEIR PRODUCE.

COMMERCIAL PRODUCER: A grower who sells this

RULES

STATE RULES APPLY

Each entry in these divisions shall have been made or produced by the exhibitor. Entries shall be made on Junior Department entry forms provided by the fair. **THE SIGNATURE OF A PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS REQUIRED.** State and local rules apply to all entries and scorecards in corresponding Adult and Junior Department classes and shall be used unless otherwise provided in these divisions. Exhibitors who are enrolled in any junior organizations for which classes are offered elsewhere are not eligible to enter these divisions.

- A. Entries must use the Division Number appropriate to the age of the exhibitor. The age of the exhibitor is determined as of the first day of the fair.
- B. CHILDREN SHALL RECEIVE ABSOLUTELY NO HELP FROM ADULTS, VIOLATION OF THIS RULE WILL BE CAUSE FOR DISQUALIFICATION.
- C. The American system of judging will be used for Teens, the Danish system for youth. The Danish System of Judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In all Junior Departments, using the Danish System of Judging, THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES SHALL BE USED BY THE JUDGES.
