BEST OF SHOW RIBBON IN EACH DIVISION Danish Judging

LIMIT: 12 different exhibits, each to be listed separately by name on the entry form.

RULES

- A. Entries can include projects such as painting (oil, water, pencil, pen and ink, pastels), drawing, dyeing of wool, as well as others listed below.
- B. If a member is entering an item that is precut or pre-stamped, he/she should attach a note stating which portion of the item he/she personally completed.
- C. Members should select articles to do within their ability and will be judged on the neatness, artistry, and finishing of the exhibit. All articles must be ready for display, with completed backs, bottoms, etc.
- D. An exhibit may consist of an item judged individually or a coordinated exhibit consisting of three to five items not entered elsewhere, with emphasis to be on the coordination of colors, texture, patterns, and shapes.

NOTE: Skill level may vary for different projects. For example, the 4-H member can be in beginning calligraphy and intermediate macramé, with a total of 12 exhibit
