# RULES FOR ALL WOOL DIVISIONS STATE RULES APPLY

- 1. All entries MUST have been completed within two years of the opening day of this fair.
- 2. Entries entered in previous El Dorado County Fairs are not eligible.
- 3. **NOVICE** classes are for those exhibitors that have never won a 1<sup>st</sup> Place or Blue Ribbon in the category that they are entering i.e.: Fleeces, Spun Fiber. Knitted Items. etc.
- 4. Classes may be combined to ensure 3 to a class. Premiums will only be paid if there are at least three in a class.

#### **FLEECES DIVISIONS**

#### **RULES (STATE RULES APPLY)**

- A. Only complete fleeces in the grease are eligible for competition; manufacturers and dealers are excluded. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth. The definition of "12 months" shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade. Thus, if a fleece is slightly more than 12 months growth, due to unavoidable delay in obtaining shearers, or by weather, it shall be termed "12 months" wool.
- B. Whether fleeces must be included in Whether classes ONLY.
- C. All fleeces entered must have been sheared from sheep owned by the exhibitor and properly skirted.
- D. Wool and Mohair fleeces must be presented in the best possible condition: skirted, properly rolled cut (flesh) side out, and placed in a large, clear, plastic bag. A 3 x 5 card must be inserted in the bag with the fleece listing the following information: 1) Owners name & address, 2) Breed and sex of the animal, 3) Breed registration number if in a purebred class. This card must be inserted in an envelope to conceal the information while judging. A lock of rinsed fleece, not washed with soap, must be attached to the envelope. Entries not following this procedure may be disqualified. Nongreasy hair fleeces and fiber must also be presented in the best possible condition, skirted, and rolled in the paper of an appropriate size.
- E. Purebred fleece should be placed in a class that most appropriately fits that Breed's Standard description of wool grade. Market or cross-bred fleece should be placed in a class that most appropriately describes its individual wool grade.
- F. If the above rules and requirements are not met, the entry may be refused at receiving.
- G. The judge has the authority to reclassify or disqualify fleeces before making awards.

#### SPUN FIBER DIVISION

#### **RULES (STATE RULES APPLY)**

- A. Skeins must be a minimum of 20 yards, must be tied in 4 places, and must be accompanied by a sample of un-spun fleece, fiber, or roving.
- B. A 3" x 5" card must accompany the skein and sample. This card must be inserted in an envelope to conceal the information while judging. The card must state: 1) fleece type, breed, or fibers used; 2) a number of ply; 3) what fiber preparation was used i.e. selfprepared, carded, combed, or commercial. If it is a blend, briefly describe how it was accomplished. OPTIONAL: If desired, the exhibitor may attach a 4"x 4" project sample that may be knitted, woven, crocheted, or other to be available for display and for touching by the public after judging.

**DIVISION 92 - HANDSPUN YARN DIVISION 93 - NOVICE HANDSPUN YARN** CLASS#

- 1. White Yarn (100% Sheep Wool) state breed

#### ONE BEST OF SHOW RIBBON AWARDED IN HAND SPUN-HANDMADE

#### RULES (STATE RULES APPLY)

- A. A small skein of yarn (minimum of 10 yards) and a sample of un-spun fleece, fiber or roving used in the item must be attached to a 3"X5" card. OPTIONAL: Exhibitor may attach 4"x 4" project sample to be available for display and for touching by the public after judging. Linings and decorative elements of commercially made materials will be allowed - Note on card.
- B. All small items, such as doilies, baby socks, etc may be securely mounted on cardboard or foam board.
- C. Yarn must be hand spun by exhibitor and finished item made by same sole exhibitor except for class 9 (group).
- D. All Items must be clean and blocked.

#### **DIVISION 94 – 100% HANDSPUN & HANDMADE ITEMS DIVISION 95 – NOVICE 100% HANDSPUN & HANDMADE ITEMS** CLASS#

- 1. 100% Handspun Knitted Afghan or blanket.

- C. All entries must be accompanied by a 3 x 5 index card with

the following info:

Fiber content, If it was dyed, who dyed it, and what type of dye was used, did you hand gather material, what is the end use of, the item and briefly tell the judge (25 words or less) anything pertinent to its creation.

#### **RULES (STATE RULES APPLY)**

- A. All small pieces, such as doilies, may be securely mounted on cardboard or foam board. OPTIONAL: Exhibitor may attach 4" x 4" project sample to be available for display and for touching by the public after judging.
- B. "Kit" items much be identified as such. The project was purchased as a kit with yarn and pattern selected.
- C. Exhibits must be clean and blocked. Stained or soiled items may be rejected at receiving.
- D. All items must be clean and "finished" in a manner appropriate for that item. For example, washing, pressing with or without steam, and/or blocking.
- E. Classes may be combined to ensure 3 to a class. Premiums will only be paid if there are at least three in a class.
