- E. For each entry, include a 3" x 5" card with the author's name, address, phone number, title of work, first sentence, division, and class numbers.
- F. Author retains all rights; however, the author must agree that entries may be displayed and used for publicity purposes at the discretion of the fair management.
- G. Danish System of Judging.
- H. Entry must be received on 8 ½ x 11 copy paper, which can be scanned into a computer to be electronically transmitted

- H. Written without reference to registered trademarks

On the back of the paper, please list your name, grade, school, and teacher, if home-schooled, please list "home-schooled."
- C. **POSTER RULES**: Posters must have a slogan or a title that matches the theme of the poster. On the back of the poster, please write, the name, school, and teacher, if home-schooled, print "homeschooled."
- D. Danish Judging.
