ARRANGEMENTS | DRIED | FRESH | SILK | ADOPT A SPOTS

RULES (STATE RULES APPLY)

- A. Sweepstakes will be awarded in accordance with State Rules IV-7.
- B. Judging will be done strictly according to the schedule. The American System of judging will be used.
- C. Every exhibit will be subject to departmental rules, but the Association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur, and entries are made and accepted on this condition.
- D. The department chair will provide entry tags. Exhibitors must verify that the information on them is correct.
- E. Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled with the common name of the plant.
- F. Exhibit/entries are not to be touched or moved by the exhibitor after being placed by the department chair.
- G. Plant material and flowers should be well hardened and groomed.
- H. Plant material on State Conservation List may not be exhibited.
- I. Exhibits in the Flowers & Plants Department must have been grown by the exhibitor except for arrangement divisions.
- J. Exhibitors must provide drainage saucers for all potted plants.
- K. Adult exhibitors must have owned potted plants at least 3 months prior to the beginning day of the Fair. (This rule does not apply to Youth exhibitors)
- L. The fair will furnish containers for all entries in the cut flower division. No bottles, tin cans, or fruit jars are accepted.
- M. Entries must include the EXACT number of blooms, stems, etc. specified on entry form. Removal of leaves is the exhibitor's choice.
- N. No dressing, wiring, artificial flower, or fillers permitted. Wedging is permitted, provided by the exhibitor.
- O. In Cut Flower Division, a stem should contain just one flower, unless otherwise noted. The exceptions are Ageratum, Cosmos, Forget-Me-Nots, French Marigolds, Petunias, and some roses. The portion of the stem of these flowers may contain more than one bloom.
- P. Hybrid Tea Roses, Hybrid Perpetuals, and large Exhibition Dahlias to be shown debudded. Stems should be approximately 9 to 12 inches or in proportion to the flower.
- Q. FRESH FOLIAGE permitted in all arrangements unless otherwise noted.
- R. FRESH FLOWERS OR PLANT MATERIAL must be used in all arrangements except those specifically indicated otherwise. NO ARTIFICIALLY COLORED fresh plant material or ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS are permitted.
- S. In Fresh Arrangements, plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor. Foliage or accessories are permitted in all classes of the Arrangements Division unless otherwise noted. No artificial flowers or dried flowers are allowed.
- T. All plant materials used in garden exhibits must be growing unless otherwise specified.
- U. Succulents may be classified by foliage. NO ARTIFICIAL foliage may be used.
- V. No Dry Arrangement entry will be accepted if the exhibit has been exhibited and placed at any previous El Dorado County Fair.
- W. **DRIED MATERIALS** may be sparingly colored and treated.

NOTE: Award checks WILL NOT be mailed; checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours no later than October 1st of the current fair year.

GLOSSARY

ANNUAL: A plant that completes its outdoor cycle of growth in one year.

BIENNIAL: A plant that normally completes its outdoor cycle of growth in two years.

PERENNIAL: A plant that lives, blooms, and seeds for more than two years. Trees and shrubs are hardwood perennials.

HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS: A plant that lives longer than two years, but in colder climates dies back to the ground each winter.

SPIKE: A flower structure with flowers, stemless or very short-stemmed, on a common length stalk, i.e., Gladiolus.

SPRAY: Portion of a plant with a number of flowers on one stem, with at least two flowers open, i.e. Cosmos and Salpiglossis.

STEM: The main ascending part of a plant.

STALK: A stiff stem that may or may not branch one or more flowers and buds.

BLOOM: Individual flowers, one blossom on a stem, i.e., H.T. Roses, Carnations, all disbudded.

SPECIMEN: A single plant, fruit, vegetable, bloom or spike, spray, stalk or stem.

NOVICE: One who has not won a blue ribbon in any organized flower show. A novice may enter Novice, Amateur, and Open Classes.

AMATEUR: One who has won 10 or fewer blue ribbons in any organized flower show, and is not, or has not been, engaged in commercial enterprise. An amateur may enter Amateur and Open Classes.

OPEN: Open to all, including judges, amateur accredited judges, instructors, and professionals.

Fantasy Garden: A whimsical landscape that's filled with magic, mystery, and other fantastical elements.

Management reserves the right to remove all unsightly material from any exhibit.
