ENTRY FEE: \$8 PER ENTRY PER CLASS

<u>ALL GOATS</u> must always have their premise identification (tattoo) and registration (for Dairy Goats and Nigerian Dwarf Dairy Goats only) on the grounds due to the Scrapies Eradication Program*. To enroll, call 877-741-3690. If you have entered a goat that has a micro-chip, you will need to exhibitor will need to bring hand-held scanner for Vet to be able to read scrapies information.

RULES

- A. All stalls must be stripped clean at end of the Fair.
- B. All Goats need to be registered with a registry, only animals with a "Certificate of Registry" (blue border) issued for purebred animals are eligible.
- C. Animals with a "Certificate of Pedigree" (brown border) issued for grade animals are not eligible. Exception: All Recorded Grades Division
- **D.** A photocopy for the registry is not acceptable (original copy OR stamped duplicate only), will need to be provided to the Livestock Office for review prior to the start of the show. If registration is "pending" and tattoo matches the documentation provided, that goat is eligible to compete.
- **E.** A permanent ear tattoo is required, microchip will be reviewed if needed as well.
- F. All does in milk, must be entered in Senior Doe class. No exceptions.
- **G.** All animals in "registered purebred breeding animal" divisions must be registered and recorded with a United States breed association in the exact name of the exhibitor (owner) as declared on the entry form.
- H. All breeding goats must be individually owned by the exhibitor for at least 30 consecutive days prior to the opening day of the fair. The management may demand such proof of ownership as it deems necessary in each case, to have papers with you on grounds.
- I. RECORDED GRADE DAIRY GOATS: A permanent ear tattoo is required. Animals with a "Certificate of Pedigree" (brown border) issued by the American Dairy Goat Association are eligible EXCEPT ANIMALS IDENTIFIED AS NATIVE ON PERFORMANCE AND NATIVE ON APPEARANCE. Animals with a "Certificate of Registry" (blue border) issued by ADGA are not eligible.
- J. All sheep and goats from out of state require official individual identification valid for 30 days after inspection of the animals, a certificate of veterinary inspection, and a California entry permit within 15 days of entering California.
- **K.** All ages are determined as of Show Date.
- L. ALL GOATS ON THE GROUNDS MUST BE ENTERED IN A CLASS OR NURSING AND UNDER 4 MONTHS OF AGE.
- M. ADGA Show Sanction Rules apply for ADGA Sanctioned divisions (AOP, Nigerian Dwarf and All Recorded Grades).
- N. Per ADGA rules, no parent, leader or spectator can offer any information to the judge or make any comments regarding the show.

NOTE: No refunds will be made for diseased animals.

^{*}No companion goats allowed on-site.

^{*}Goats may not be shown by more than one (1) exhibitor. No sharing of animals in 4-H, FFA or Grange exhibits.

^{*}Primary goat entries limited to one (1) entry per exhibitor and sharing goats among family members is prohibited.

Junior/Senior Does not separate in Division - Class, but noted as such for Champion Ribbons; not in other species.

RULES

- A. ALL stalls must be stripped clean at end of the Fair.
- B. All Market Goats must be individually owned by the exhibitor for at least 60 consecutive days prior to the opening day of the fair.
- C. An out-billing from a sales yard must be made out to the exhibitor, showing 60 consecutive days of ownership, or a signed statement that the animal was dropped from the exhibitor's doe and raised by the exhibitor, or a purchase receipt showing 60 consecutive days ownership.
- D. Market goats must have milk teeth in normal positions and no permanent teeth showing at that time. Any goat having lost any of its milk teeth will be disqualified. All mouths inspected at weigh-in.
- E. This show is open to any breed or crossbred female (un-bred) or Wether goat. Any animal showing signs of pregnancy or testicular development will be disqualified.
- Market goats Does and Wethers are allowed, no bucks allowed.

- G. Fitting Goats must be slick shorn with 3/8" hair or less at the time of arrival. Does and whether eligible. Goats must be disbudded. Wethers and Does from all breed classes will be co-exhibited in the market show classes.
- H. After weighing, market goats will be broken into classes by weight for convenience of judging. There will be no minimum or maximum numbers of animals per weight class.
- I. Market Goats must weigh a minimum of 60 pounds. Goats weighing more than 100 pounds will have their sale weight adjusted to 100 pounds.
- J. Age determined as of show date.
- K. American System of Judging.

DIVISION 800 - OTHER \$5 PER CLASS: CLASS

- Owner Bred. You MUST enter a Market Class and this class (4-H. FFA, GRANGE, INDEPENDENT) to qualify. Ribbons will be given to 1st through 3rd place finishers. All Owner Breds show in one class together.
- 2. Pair of Market Goats. Must be owned and exhibited by the same exhibitor.
- 3. County Bred County-bred. Market Goat must be born and raised in El Dorado County.

*NOTE: All exhibitors selling at auction MUST participate in a SHOWMANSHIP in this species.

Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion – MUST SELL an exhibitor may sell only one animal in the sale, regardless of species. If one exhibitor has more than one champion, the highest placing champion must sell.

After weighing, market goats will be broken into classes by weight for convenience in judging.

4-H, GRANGE, and FFA GROUPS

The class consists of five (5) breeding or market animals exhibited in preceding divisions. Animals owned by at least four (4) different exhibitors from one club or chapter.

NO ENTRY FEE

DIVISION 514 –CLUB, CHAPTER, OR GROUP CLASS

1. Five animals exhibited by at least four (4) exhibitors. Chapters and Clubs are requested to sign-up in the Livestock Office prior to the show beginning.

*As a result of the new USDA Scrapie Eradication Program, all goats and sheep entering fairs are required to have individual identification on the animal. The official identification may be official USDA individual identification ear tags, premises ear tags, Scrapie Flock Certification Program ear tags, registration tattoos if accompanied by registration papers, or other methods approved by the California Department of Food and Agriculture **including a Premise ID.** All goats and sheep from out of state are required to have official individual identification, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit.
